**Kyle, 12, Wants a Family that Will Help Him Stay Busy**



Kyle, age 12 describes himself as "very polite with a good sense of humor" who likes to play outside, eat ice cream and watch movies. A bright boy with a big smile and fun personality, he likes to stay busy with activities like fishing, swimming, baseball and kickball. Kyle also enjoys playing video games and listening to music.

Describing his future adoptive family he says, "I'd like a family that will help me stay busy and give me lots of praise when I earn it." Kyle also wants a family who will take the time to build a relationship with him because it may take time to develop trust. He likes receiving praise from others and does well when he gets a lot of encouragement and positivity from adults. Kyle needs an active family who is committed to accessing ongoing support services.

### Lenient Sentence Rankles Russia

The Russian government called an American court verdict of 19 months for the death of a child adopted from Russia, "amazingly and flagrantly irresponsible." A judge credited the Pennsylvania couple accused in the case with time already served, releasing them. The boy was said to be diagnosed with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder, the adoptive parents saying that he repeatedly hurt himself due to

serious emotional and mental problems. Russian officials may be conducting their own investigation and might seek an arrest warrant for the couple.

### **Couples Relocating to China to Adopt**

Since 1992 families have been adopting children from China where families were required to travel to the mainland to finalize adoptions. These parents have been coming from all over the world with more than 70,000 Chinese infants being adopted from the U.S. For most families, returning to the states is common but for some families, a quick trip and tour are not enough. These families are relocating to China. Alex and Elizabeth Reid have three adopted children from China and needed no convincing of making the move to China permanently when Alex's Ohio-based company needed someone to help expand in Asia. The Reids are hoping a connection to the children's home culture will give them a stronger sense of identity and self-worth. "The whole issue of identity for adopted kids is really important," says Elizabeth Reid.

### **International Adoption Falls Sharply**

According to data released by the State Department in its annual report on Intercountry Adoption, adoptions to the United States from other countries have declined steadily since 2004 with a decrease of 1,338 since 2010. China, Russia and Ethiopia were the largest countries of origin for children adopted by Americans.

### **Native Summit Addresses Past Abuse in Adoption**

The First Nations Repatriation Institute's second annual adult adoptee summit held at the University of Minnesota featured a panel of child-welfare professionals, judges, lawyers, community activists and scholars from various tribes. The panelists addressed past wrongs inflicted under a federal Indian Adoption Project from 1958 to 1967 that removed eighty-five percent of the Native children from their families from 1941 to 1967 and placed them in non-Indian homes or institutions. The panelists suggested think tanks, scientific research, and future conferences to address the history and to provide healing. Since Native children are over-represented in out-of-home placements, the experts said the judges need educating. They also suggested that adoption records be made available at a tribal level to help Native persons find and return to their families.

## Secret Daughter of Clark Gable & Loretta Young Dies

Judy Lewis, whose famous parents were a Hollywood secret kept from everyone including her, died on November 25, 2011. She was adopted by her birth mother, Loretta Young, who had become pregnant with Clark Gable while making the movie *Call of the Wild*. Young was a devout Catholic with a wholesome image that she was afraid would be tarnished if the public knew about her daughter's origins. Born with the famous Gable ears that jutted out, Lewis underwent plastic surgery at age 7 to make them less like her birth father's. A fiancé revealed the identity of her parents to Lewis, telling her everyone knew but her.

### PATH Changes Name and Direction

### Metro Rates of Homeless Teens Rise

A recent KARE 11 extra found that more than 2,500 of Minnesota youth, ages 16-21, are homeless on any given night. Many of the

youth had aged out of foster care into an automatic forced emancipation. Youth interviewed by Rena Sariagianopoulos of KARE 11 resorted to sleeping on buses and staying with friends, when possible. Few emergency shelters are available for this age group.
